Exactly in this street lived **Bryan Epstein** – house number 24



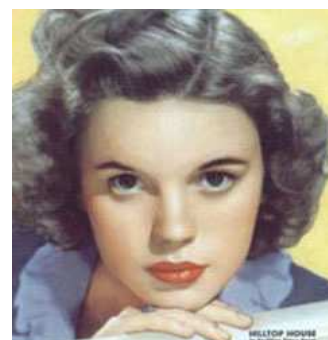

In an interview Mick Jagger said that he had to move with Marianne in this simple house, because she wanted to see the white bridge. But later they had to move out because it wasn't save enough.

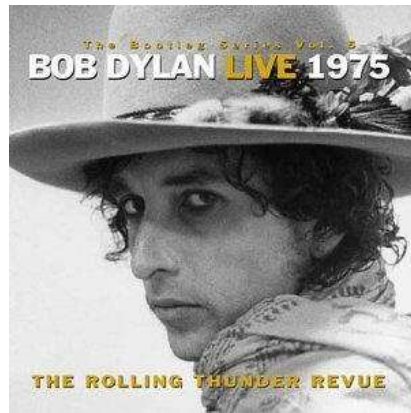


So and now we are in **Kensington Gore SW7 2AP** London, right before the Royal Albert Hall, where Simply Red are currently playing.

Jimi Hendrix (November 27, 1942, Seattle, Washington – September 18, 1970, London, England) was an American guitarist, singer and songwriter. Hendrix is recognized as one of the greatest and most influential guitarists in rock music history. After initial success in England, he achieved worldwide fame following his 1967 performance at the Monterey Pop Festival. Later, Hendrix headlined the iconic 1969 Woodstock Festival before his death in 1970, at the age of 27. He defined and changed the sound of the E-guitar.

Now the hall is used as a live music venue, it has featured bands such as Led Zeppelin and the Beatles. Graduation ceremonies for students of London's prestigious Imperial College are also held in the hall.
